### ■ MANUFACTURE

This Reference Product comes from sites that have received ISO14001 certification.



### ■ DISTRIBUTION

Products are distributed from logistics centres located with a view to optimize transport efficiency. The Reference Product is therefore transported over an average distance of 780 km by road from our warehouse to the local point of distribution into the European market.

Packaging is compliant with european directive 2004/12/EU concerning packaging and packaging waste. At their end of life, its recyclability rate is 96 % (in % of packaging weight).



### ■ INSTALLATION

For the installation of the product, only standard tools are needed.



### ■ USE

Under normal conditions of use, this product requires no servicing, no maintenance or additional products.

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### END OF LIFE

The product end-of-life factors are taken into account during the design phase. Dismantling and sorting of components or materials is made as easy as possible with a view to recycling or failing that, another form of reuse.

#### • Recyclability rate:

Calculated using the method described in technical report IEC/TR 62635, the recyclability rate of the product is estimated at 89 %. This value is based on data collected from a technological channel operating on an industrial basis. It does not pre-validate the effective use of this channel for the end of life of this product.

Separated into:

- plastic materials (excluding packaging) : 34 %
- metal materials (excluding packaging) : 6 %
- others (excluding packaging) : 10 %
- packaging (all types of materials) : 39 %



### ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS

The evaluation of environmental impacts examines the stages of the Reference Product life cycle: manufacturing, distribution, installation, use and end-of-life. It is representative from products marketed and used in Europe, in compliance with the local current standards.

For each phase, the following modelling elements were taken in account:
