MANUFACTURE

This Reference Product comes from sites that have received ISO14001 certification.



Products are distributed from logistics centres located with a view to optimize transport efficiency. The Reference Product is therefore transported over an average distance of 1406 km by road and 9 km by sea from our warehouse to the local point of distribution into the market in all around the world.

Packaging is compliant with applicable regulation. At their end of life, its recyclability rate is 94 % (in % of packaging weight).



For the installation of the product, only standard tools are needed.



USE

Under normal conditions of use, this product requires no servicing, no maintenance or additional products.

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END OF LIFE


